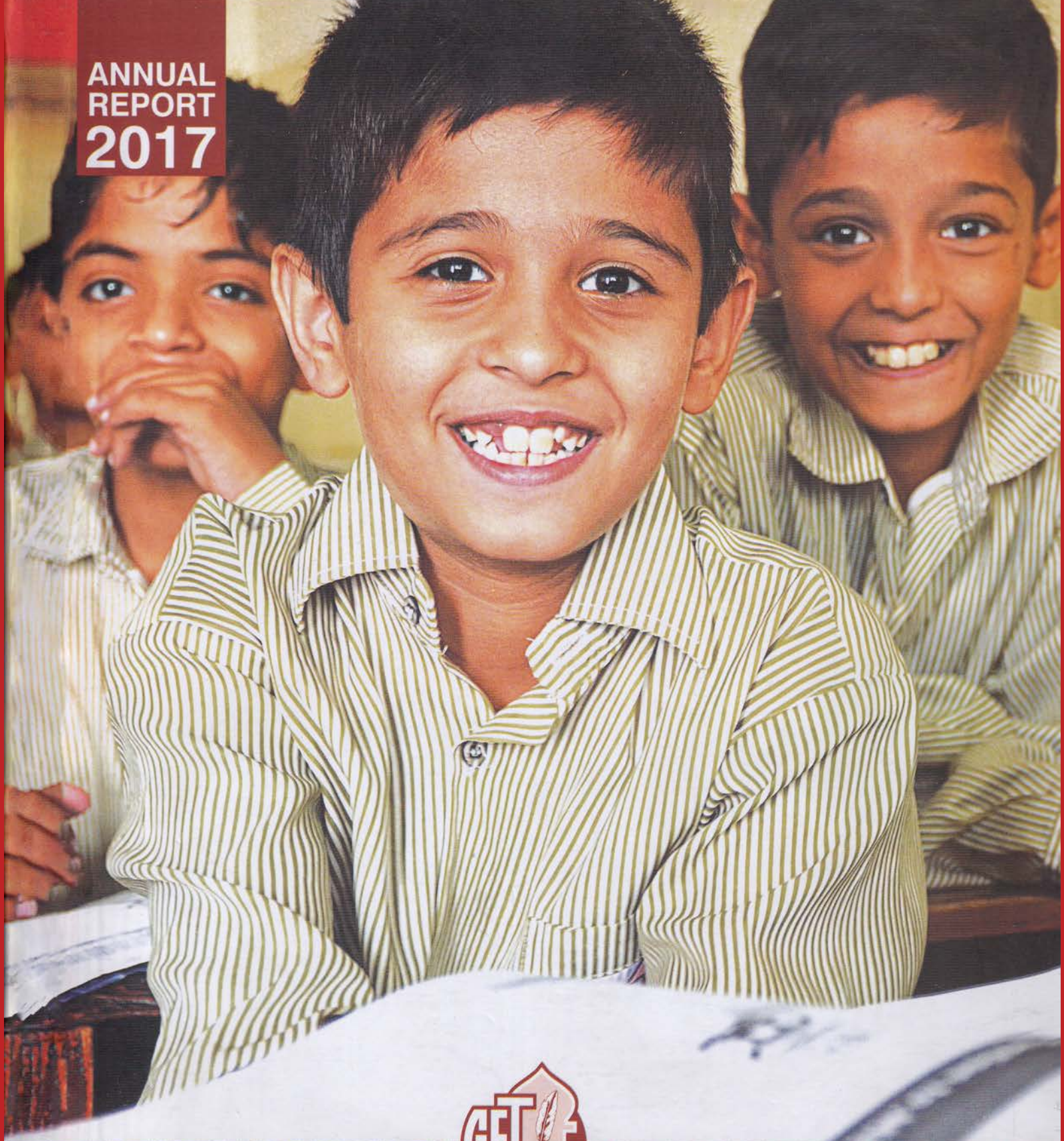

Through its vast network of 668 schools, GET is providing value-based education to more than 90000 students in 35 districts of Pakistan.

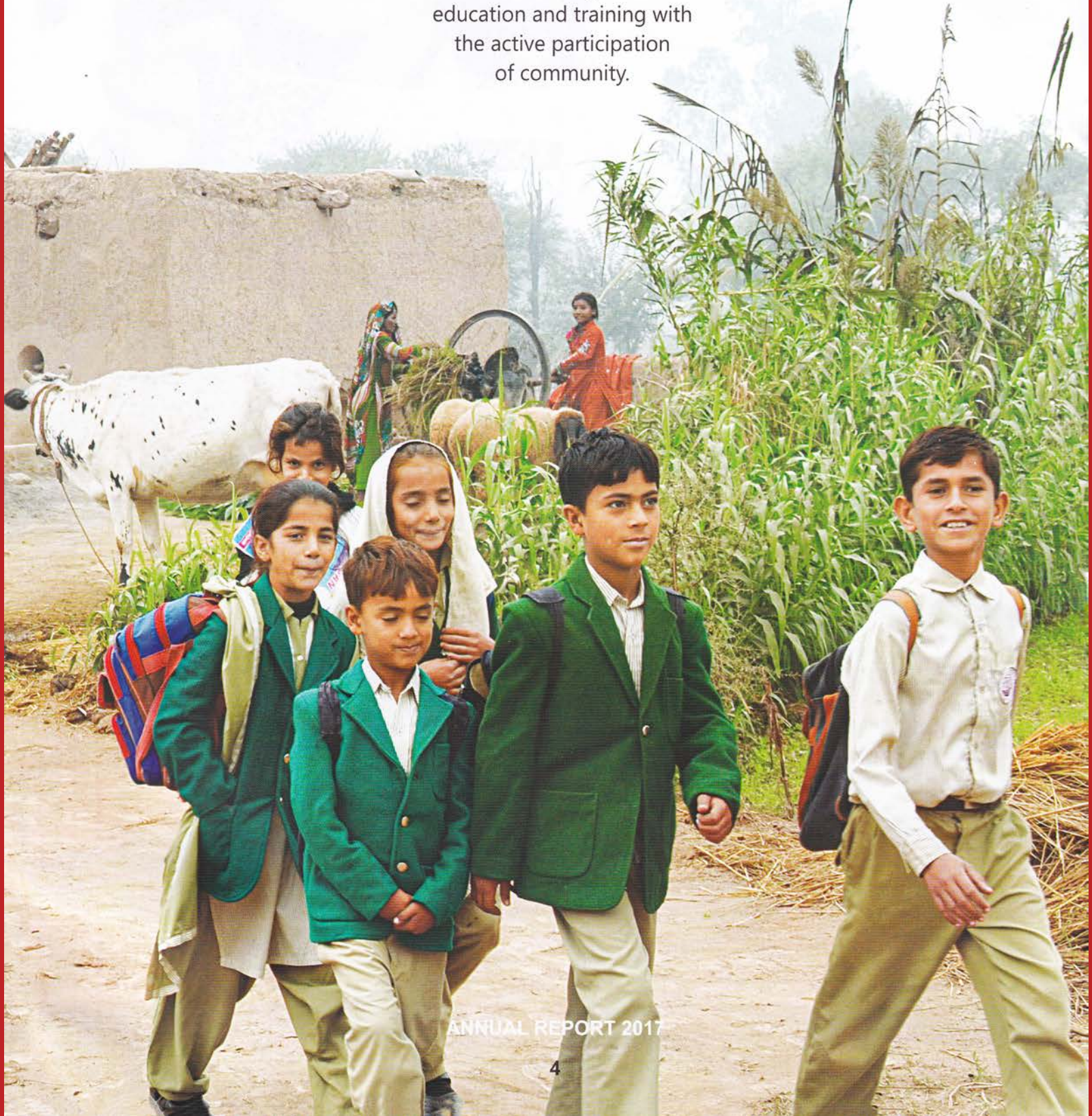

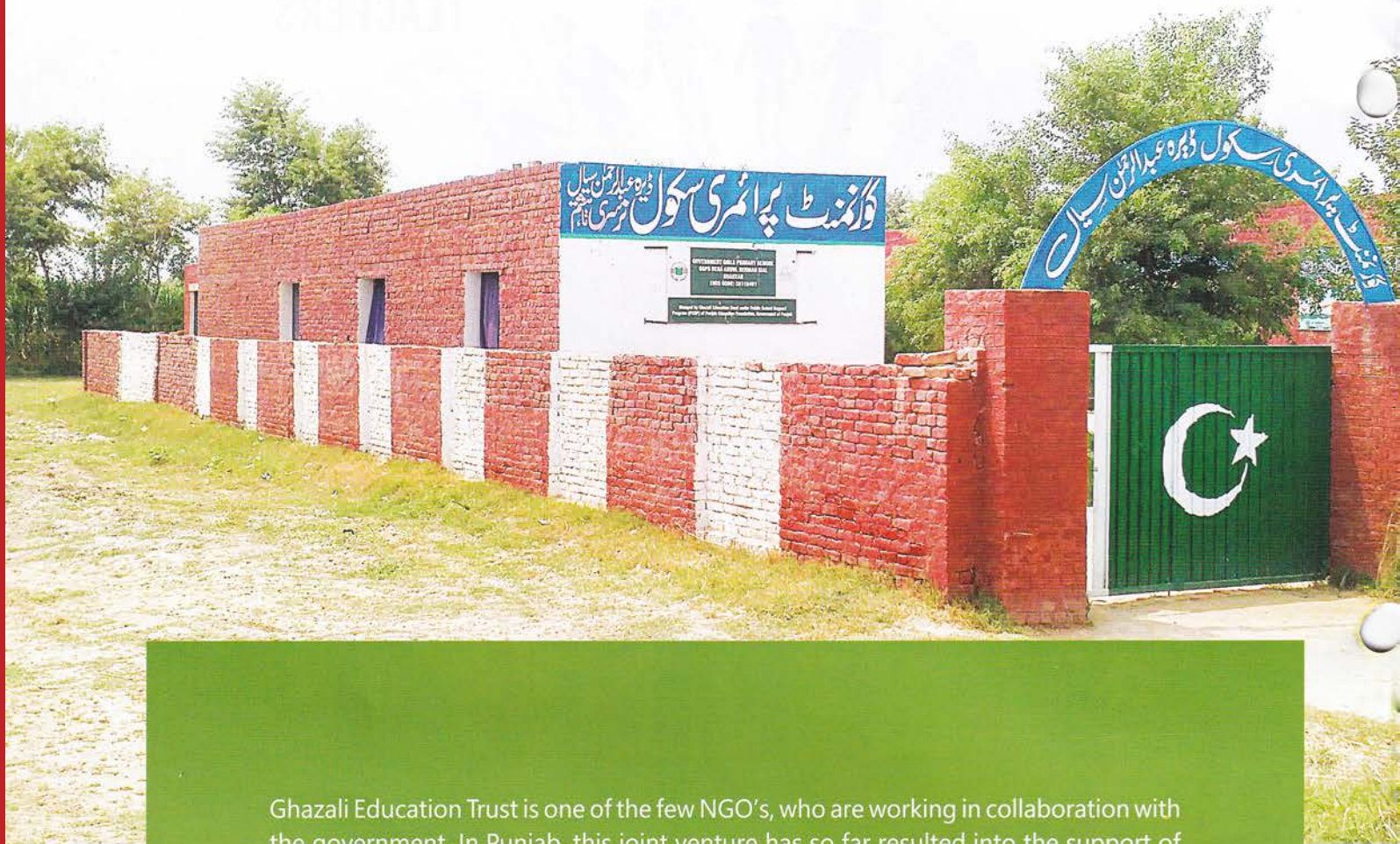

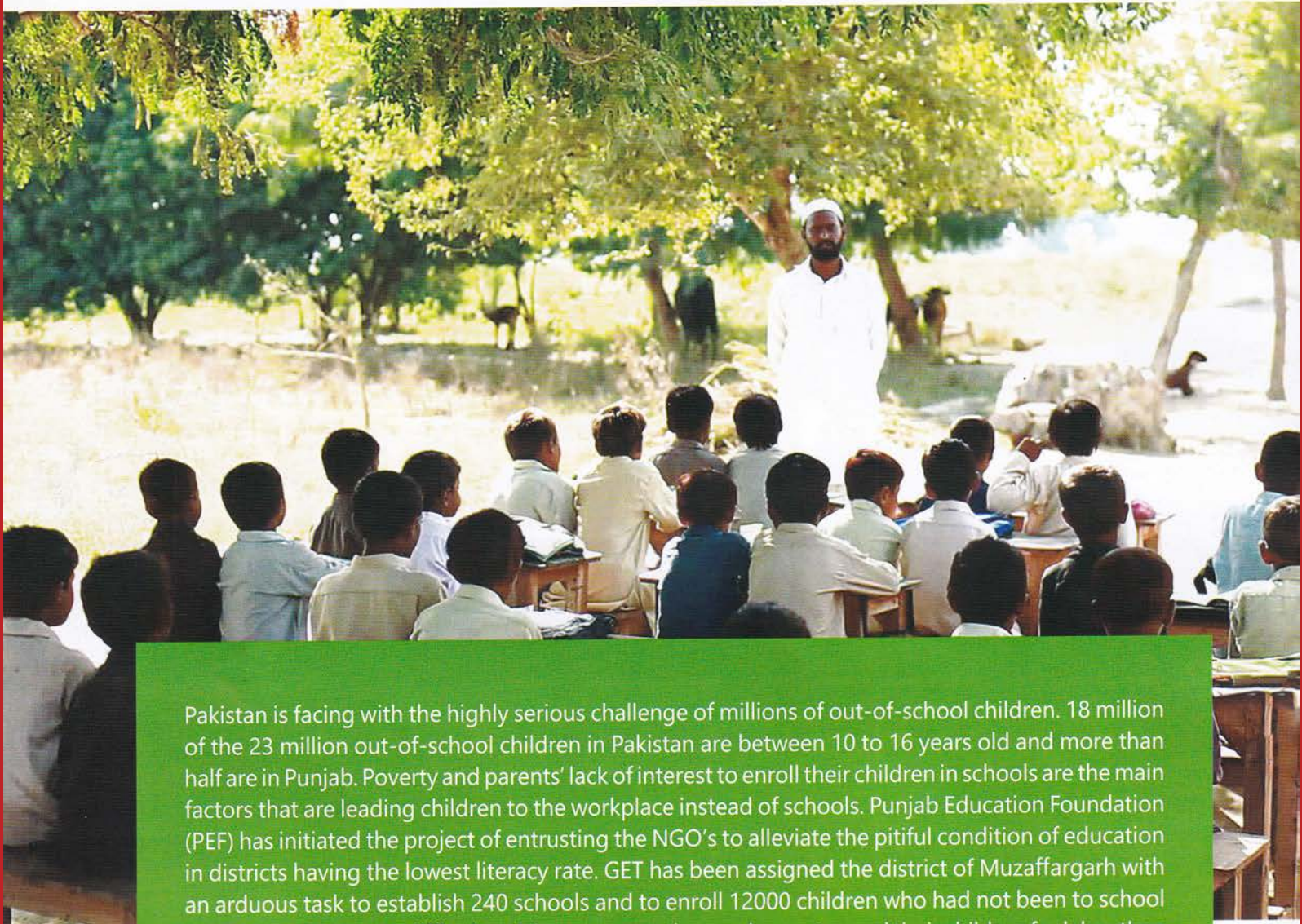


PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP



Ghazali Education Trust is one of the few NGO's, who are working in collaboration with the government. In Punjab, this joint venture has so far resulted into the support of 355 schools in rural areas of Pakistan.

OUT OF SCHOOL CHILDREN PROJECT



Pakistan is facing with the highly serious challenge of millions of out-of-school children. 18 million of the 23 million out-of-school children in Pakistan are between 10 to 16 years old and more than half are in Punjab. Poverty and parents' lack of interest to enroll their children in schools are the main factors that are leading children to the workplace instead of schools. Punjab Education Foundation (PEF) has initiated the project of entrusting the NGO's to alleviate the pitiful condition of education in districts having the lowest literacy rate. GET has been assigned the district of Muzaffargarh with an arduous task to establish 240 schools and to enroll 12000 children who had not been to school even for a day. It was a difficult task because people were happy to send their children for labor than to school. GET has established 241 schools in which more than 21000 students are fulfilling their quest of knowledge. Comprehensive teacher training sessions has made us to claim the greatest victory so far, we have achieved 100% result in quality assurance test (QAT) conducted by the PEF.

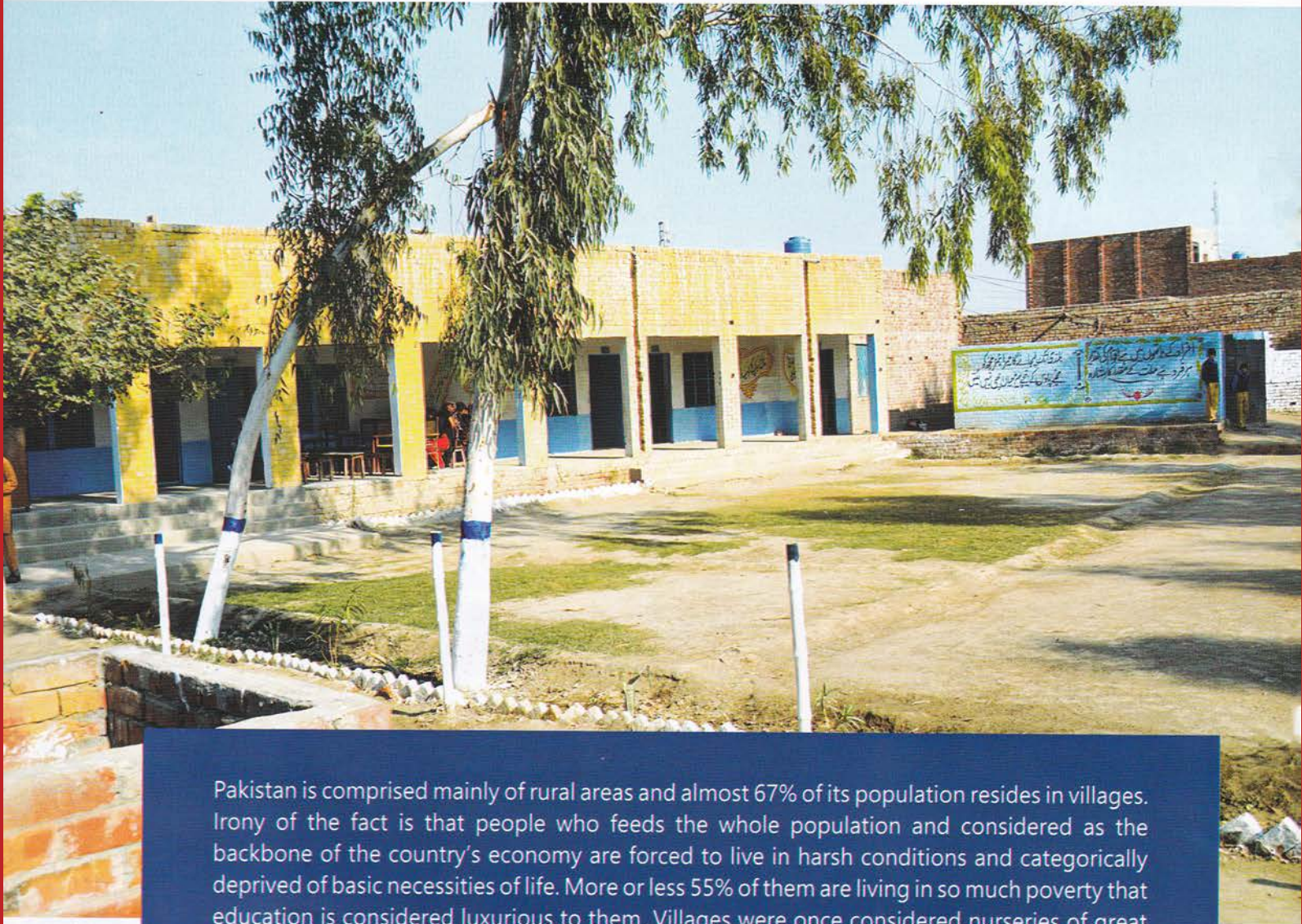

Pakistan is comprised mainly of rural areas and almost 67% of its population resides in villages. Irony of the fact is that people who feeds the whole population and considered as the backbone of the country's economy are forced to live in harsh conditions and categorically deprived of basic necessities of life. More or less 55% of them are living in so much poverty that education is considered luxurious to them. Villages were once considered nurseries of great minds, but chunk of community has completely been deprived of education and also with the opportunities that comes with it. Thus, at the moment of its inception, Ghazali Education Trust has decided to open a network of schools solely in villages so that villagers could have an easy access to quality education.

PAKISTAN RURAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Pakistan Rural Education Program (PREP) was established in 1997 by Ghazali Education Trust. PREP identified the remote areas of Pakistan where the educational opportunities were not available or the existing facilities and schools were not adequate to fulfill the educational needs of the community. The research of PREP identified the gaps of quality education between urban and rural areas of Pakistan. Moreover, PREP focuses on building bridges between the educational facilities provided in the rural areas escalating the academic standards in the countryside. The basic purpose of PREP is to establish new self-sustained schools in underprivileged areas and the infrastructural development of already existing schools.

Ghazali Premier Higher Secondary School is a step in this direction. Students studying in GET schools are selected through National Testing Service (NTS) to study on a scholarship in Ghazali Premier High School. GET bears the full residential and educational cost of selected students. 24 hour schedule has been enacted in GPC which makes them disciplined and punctual and sets their habits for times to come. Pioneer batch of GPC students has been passed out and marked a great success for us. All students have passed their intermediate examination with distinction. Three of our students have got admission in medical colleges on open merit and 19 of them have got admission in other professional degrees on merit.

EDUCATION FOR HINDU COMMUNITY



The plight of Hindu community, residing in Sindh and southern Punjab. Hindu community of these areas were marginalized and deprived. They were too afraid to send their children to mainstream schools. GET realized Hindu community's qualms and worriedness regarding their children education and future. We, then, laid the foundation of a resilient program. We invited the people from their community to come teach their children and even hired principal from their community. Currently, GET has established 6 schools in which 608 students are being provided with an opportunity to get modern education in congenial atmosphere. Standard text-books are being taught in schools; however, teachers are allowed to teach their religious teachings in their own language. Sanskrit, Hindi, and Deva-Nagri writing system is being taught in these schools. We also help them in celebrating their religious festivals such as Holi and Devali.

ORPHAN & NEEDY SUPPORT PROGRAM

Millions of children in Pakistan have been swayed from schools to workshops. Socio-economic circumstances in childhood which result in low qualification in adulthood help transmit poverty across generations. GET has initiated "Orphan/Needy support program (ONSC)" to support those children who lack sufficient means to get education due to orphanage or poverty. Currently, 43058 orphan and needy students are benefitting from GET's comprehensive educational program exclusively designed for the orphan and the needy students in more than 35 districts of Pakistan. They are being given complete educational package including support material like shoes, bags, uniforms etc. Moreover, we have offered "Higher Education Scholarship Programme" to distinctive students. In short, we have developed, in our best capacity, a complete mechanism to support those poor souls. However, we have yet managed to sustain thousands of students and due to the lack of resources. Millions of poor souls are waiting for the attention of the whole country.

RURAL INCLUSIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

One of the major problems special children are confronting is the societal stereotype attached to them once they diagnosed as a child with special needs. Specific mind-set has made many special children dislodged from the rest of society. GET's inclusive programme is based on a belief that abnormalities can be cured with the right treatment and education. Team of professionals, psychologists, special educationists and trainers supervise the learning process of special children. Each special student studying in our Resource Rooms is being evaluated on regular basis. Therefore, we have managed to apportion hundreds of special students to normal classes. Currently, our 23 resource rooms are providing advanced education to more than 500 special students, yet there is a dire need to do more. We are expecting to open more resource rooms so that we could entail maximum number of students.

PROVISION OF INCLUSIVE EDUCATION



Special children need special attention. 10% of the population with special needs are being completely deprived of due attention they seek. One of the major problems they are confronting is the lack of special educational institutions. Therefore, Ghazali Education Trust has initiated "Rural Inclusive Education Program" for the children who require special needs in its schools. The purpose behind this program is to provide education to them so that they could have a chance to live a normal life.

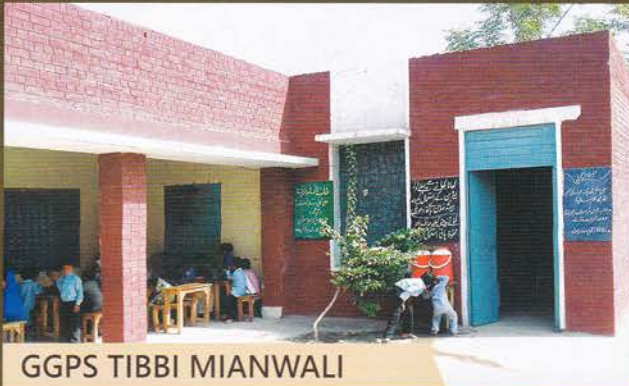

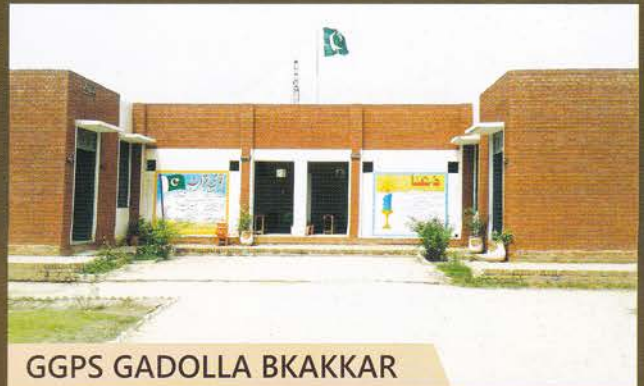

OUR DEPARTMENTS

Research & Development

R&D designs educational standards, teachers and students support material and teachers development. Therefore, it organizes different training courses for the teachers to improve their teaching and pedagogical skills.

Resource Mobilization

RMD is working for mobilizing the resources to strengthen the organizational capacity and deliver benefits to the community. RMD keeps itself in constant touch with the donors at home and abroad as well.

Monitoring and Evaluation

It reviews and assesses the progress towards objectives and identifies the problems and developing strategies to measure the performance and effectiveness through various tools. Therefore, it analyzes and collects the data to maintain or improve the quality of education in GET school.

Program Development Unit

Core purpose of establishment of PDU was find new support sources for Ghazali Education Trust along with the establishment of liaison with the new development partners. The PDU team is responsible for proposal writing, developing relations with corporate donors as well.

Marketing

It is responsible to build strong relation with the public and other organizations. Through affective advertisement and marketing campaigns, department promotes the core values of the trust in the community and attracts the potential donors to help in the generation of resources.

Land and Acquisition

LACD shares the responsibility to plan, design and construct the purpose-built campuses, after purchasing the land and execute and monitor the system for further streamlining of school projects. Moreover, it keeps all the record of land, building and the expenditure renders on it to ensure the transparency.

Accounts and Finance

Its purpose to establish an accountable and transparent financial system in order to build financial sustainability. It covers a wide range of financial activities from basic book keeping to provide information to managers in making strategic decisions and manage the organization's cash flow.

Internal Audit

It obtains analyses and evaluates accounting documentation, previous reports, data, flowcharts etc. It also prepares and present reports that reflect audit's results and other processing document.

Administration

Office administration is one of the key elements associated with a high level of workplace productivity and efficiency. It provides logistic support to the organization and involves in the procurement of basic inventory like the provision of fixtures in GET schools.
